Before you invest in any fund, consider how the fund would work with your other investments and your tolerance for risk.

This Fund is an alternative mutual fund. It is permitted to invest in asset classes or use investment strategies that are not permitted for other types of mutual funds. The specific strategies that differentiate this Fund from other types of mutual funds include: increased use of derivatives for hedging and non-hedging purposes; increased ability to sell securities short; and the ability to borrow cash to use for investment purposes. While these strategies will be used in accordance with the Fund's investment objectives and strategies, during certain market conditions they may accelerate the pace at which your investment decreases in value.

What does the Fund invest in?

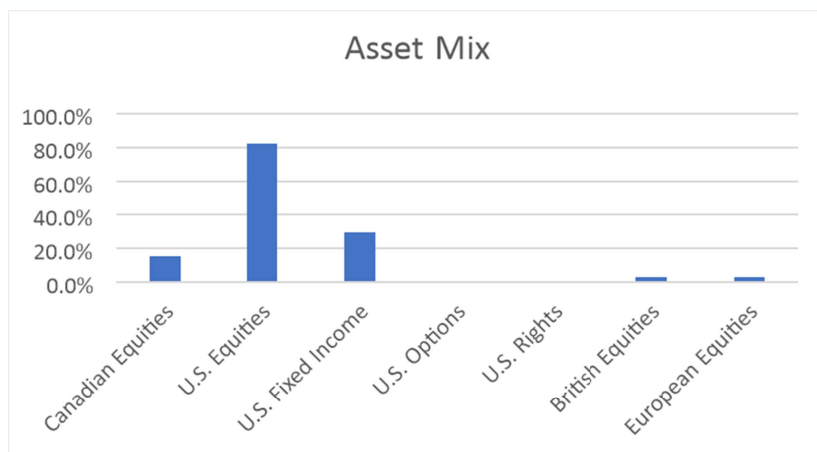
The Fund intends to invest primarily in securities in Canada, the United States and in other foreign jurisdictions to generate consistent, positive absolute returns, with low volatility and low correlation to equity markets. To achieve its investment objectives, the Fund will primarily focus on merger arbitrage by investing in securities of companies that are involved in publicly announced mergers (including mergers through takeovers and tender offers). Merger arbitrage is a highly specialized investment approach generally designed to profit from the successful completion of merger transactions. The Fund may engage in physical short sales and borrowing for investment purposes. The Fund may also use leverage through the use of cash borrowing, short selling and specified derivatives. The Fund's aggregate gross exposure to short selling, cash borrowing and derivatives used for leverage must not exceed 300% of its net asset value, calculated on a daily basis.

How risky is it?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

The Manager has rated the volatility of this Fund as **Low**.

Because this is a new fund, the risk rating is only an estimate by the Manager. Generally, the rating is based on how much the Fund's returns have changed from year to year. It does not tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

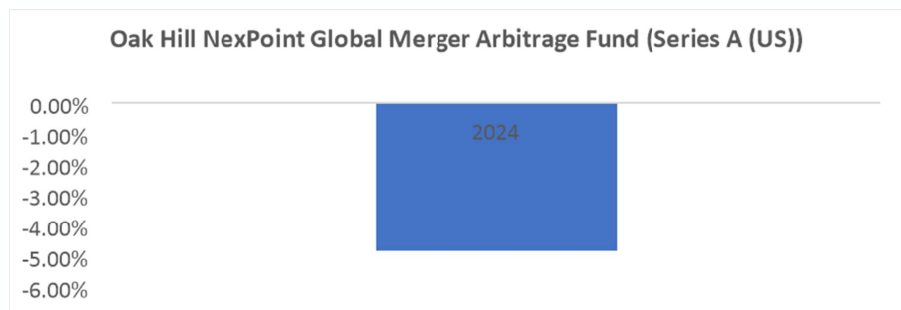
Like most mutual funds, the Fund does not have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

How has the Fund performed?

This section tells you how the Series A (US\$) Units of the Fund have performed over the past calendar year. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the total returns you receive on your investment.

Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how Series A (US\$) Units of the Fund performed over the past calendar year. The Fund dropped in value in the past calendar year. The range of returns and changes from year to year can help you assess how risky the Fund has been in the past. It is important to note that this does not tell how the Fund will perform in the future.



Best and worst 3-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series A (US\$) Units of the fund in a 3-month period over the past calendar year. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you can afford to take in a short period of time.

Average Return

A person who invested \$1,000 in the fund since inception now has \$1,065.13. This works out to an annual compound return of 3.90%.

Who is this Fund for?

This Fund may be right for you if:

- You are looking for an alternative mutual fund that provides exposure to securities in Canada, the United States and foreign jurisdictions using an arbitrage strategy with low volatility and low correlation to equity markets;
- you are seeking capital gains over the long term; and
- you can tolerate a low level of risk.

A word about tax

In general, you will have to pay tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series A (US\$) Units of the Fund. The fees and expenses, including any commissions, can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales Charges:

You have to choose a sales charge option when you buy Series A (US\$) Units of the Fund. Ask about the pros and cons of each option.

SALES CHARGE OPTION	WHAT YOU PAY	HOW IT WORKS
Initial Sales Charge	0% to 5% of the amount you buy \$0 to \$50 on every \$1,000 you buy	You and your representative decide on the rate, up to a maximum amount of 5% of the total amount invested. The initial sales charge is deducted from the amount of your subscription and is paid to your registered representative.

2. Fund Expenses:

You do not pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the Fund's returns.

As of June 30, 2025, the fund's expenses were 4.93% of its value. This equals \$49.30 for every \$1,000 invested.

Management expense ratio (MER)

This is the total of the fund's management fee (including the trailing commission) and operating expenses.

Trading expense ratio (TER)

These are the fund's trading costs.

The Fund's expenses are made up of management fees, performance fees, operating expenses and trading costs. The annual management fee for Series A (US\$) Units of the Fund is 2% of the aggregate net asset value of Series A (US\$) Units of the Fund on the preceding business day.

The Fund pays the Manager a quarterly performance fee equal to 15% of the amount by which the total return of the Series A (US\$) Units of the Fund exceeds the previous high water mark for the Series A (US\$) Units. The total return is calculated after accounting for all other expenses of the Fund.

The Fund's expenses, including the management fee and performance fee, are subject to applicable taxes.

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own Units of the Fund. It is for services and advice that your representative and their firm provide to you.

The Manager pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the Fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The rate depends on the sales charge option you choose.

For Series A (US\$) Units of the Fund, the Manager pays your representative's firm a trailing commission on the value of Series A (US\$) Units of the Fund held at an annual rate of 1%. This is the equivalent of \$10 per \$1,000 invested.

3. Other Fees:

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch Series A (US\$) Units of the Fund.

FEE	WHAT YOU PAY
Short-Term Trading Fee	A fee of 1% of the amount redeemed may be charged by the Fund if you redeem units of the Fund within 30 days of purchasing such units. Under certain circumstances and at the Manager's discretion, the fee may not apply. See the "Fees and Expenses Payable Directly by You – Short-Term Trading Fees" section of the Fund's simplified prospectus.
Switch and Reclassification Fee	Your Dealer may charge you a switch or reclassification fee, as applicable, of up to 2% based on the net asset value of the applicable series of units of a Fund you switch or reclassify. You may negotiate the amount with your Dealer. Dealers' fees for switches or reclassifications are paid by redeeming units held by you.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
